





States committed to testing rape kits with vibrant arrestee DNA programs are seeing REMARKABLE results

"During what police say was a 20-year killing spree in Milwaukee, Walter Ellis left his DNA behind all along the way, everywhere but the one place it might have saved a life."



A 31-year criminal record, links to 9 homicides

Watter E. Ellis is charged with two courts of first-degree intentional termicide in connection with the wallings of Joyce Mins in 1997 and Outhmour Stokes in 2007, but Ellis' DNA has been found on at least nine termiles killed in Milwa were between 1996 and 2007. Ellis has a long record of arrests and convictions, beginning with a burgary in 1978.

- Nov.1978 Ello is convicted of felony burglary, receives 4 years of probation.
- May 1979. Convicted of an unspecified drug charge, fired.
- May 1980: Avested on suspicion of solicitating prostitutes no changes filed.
- June 1980: Arrested on notibery, accusation, case dismissed three days later.
- June 1982: Convicted of delivery of controlled substance. He receives 2 years of probation.
- Nov. 1981. Amediad for possession with intent to deliver, a violation of his probation. He is convicted. He spends more than three years in prison from December 1981 until Feorusry 1985. He remains on probation until Nov. 4 1986.
- Sopt. 1985: Charges of soliciting prostitutes and bettery are dismissed.
